



Blue Dream Agility | AAC Agility Trial



All About Dogs is excited to host our 13th AAC Sanctioned Agility Trial

A Trial of many firsts! We welcome Christine Mandy for her first judging assignment at the Blue Dream. Christine will be judging a Biathlon class designed by Judge Wendy Beard. We will also be adding two Open classes in both Snookers and Gamblers so that each competitor can double their chances of getting those last Q's towards their titles. Plus we are also offering overnight dry camping for the first time.

Trial Dates: Saturday July 11th & Sunday July 12th, 2026

Judges: Christine Mandy, Lona O'Reilly and Wendy Beard

Location: Blue Dream Farm, 569093 Sideroad 6, The Town of the Blue Mountains

This trial will be held indoors on packed dirt footing.

Ring size is 60' x 120' with a fully enclosed gated ring.

Electronic timing, Galican 2.0 rubberized contacts, self-healing tire jump, PVC and aluminum jumps.

IMPORTANT UPDATES:

AAC Height Cards:

AAC has been making some changes to streamline the dog measurement and check in processes.

1. If your dog has received its permanent height card please send us a digital copy showing the front and back of your dog's card to the Trial Secretary when you register.
2. Dogs under two need to bring their temporary height card to all events to show proof of initial measurement.
3. Dogs over two years old must be measured **at each trial** until their final height measurement has been determined.

Please make sure you are following these protocols as AAC may not award qualifying scores without a valid card on file

The "All About Dogs" trial will be listed and simply click on the link to register.

Once registered, please email your registration to the Trial Secretary along with a scan/copy of your Dog's Height/ ID Card.

Please let us know if your dog needs a measurement at this trial.

- Trial same day move ups and additional runs the day of will be permitted: \$25 per run

Mandatory: Check-In and Review of Dog's Height /ID Card

Dog measurement available at 8:15 am.

General briefing at 8:45am with first walk through at 9 am.

We need your help!!

Trials cannot run without the help of volunteers, so please be prepared to pitch in between your scheduled runs to help us keep the event running smoothly and efficiently. A volunteer sign-up sheet located at the event check-in table so you can choose suitable times and tasks: bar setting, timing, scribing, leash running, gate stewarding. If you've never volunteered at a trial before, our volunteer coordinator will assist you. By entering this trial, you understand that all handlers must be available to help out or share jobs.

Confirmations will be posted to our website and will be emailed to participants. Upon receipt, please check your confirmation details to be sure that all your information, dog ID number, classes and jump heights are correct and notify us immediately if any errors have been made.

Refund policy:

There will be no refunds for withdrawn entries, except for injured dogs and bitches in season when the request is accompanied with a note from your veterinarian. In this case, a refund would be subject to a \$25 admin fee. No refunds on the day of the trial or if a dog and/or handler are dismissed from the competition regardless of the reason.

Notice to Competitors:

This trial will run rain or shine and is being held under the Agility Association of Canada (AAC) Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the AAC Rules and Regulations. All agility obstacles will be chosen from those described in the AAC Rule Book. Ribbons:

In each of the Standard and Games rounds, ribbons will be awarded 1st to 4th place in each height division in each of the Regular, Special, and Veteran classes. A flat qualifying ribbon will be awarded to all dogs that achieve a qualifying score in any class. New title ribbons are awarded, one per dog, with a side tab for each title earned at the trial.

Getting your Dog Measured:

If your dog has not been measured, it must be measured before it can run a course. Dogs 2 years and over need 2 measurements by two different judges on a permanent height card.

If your dog is under 2, you will need to show his/her temporary ID card for measurement for their first event. Once your dog is 2 years of age you must bring your permanent height for your dogs' official height measurement to be recorded. At this point you will need 2 measurements by two different judges in order to finalize your dog's permanent height card.

This test is being held under the Agility Association of Canada Inc. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the AAC Rules and Regulations, to include but not limited to the following:

- This test is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression towards people or other dogs.
- No food or other training aids/devices shall be permitted on the course at any time (this includes in your pockets).
- FEO (For Exhibition Only) Runs - a non-audible toy is permitted if the Handler has declared the run as FEO.
- Any handler who is found to abuse a dog will be disqualified.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open, or be completed, by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, acts of God, public emergency, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- All competitors participate in the events at their own risk. The General Agreement on the online entry form must be signed in order to comply with AAC's acceptance.

Classes and Categories

1. AAC Starters Class:

The Starters class shall be for dogs not having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title. A dog must achieve 3 clear Starter Standard rounds under 2 different judges to be awarded the ADC title.

2. AAC Advanced Class:

The advanced class shall be for dogs having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title, but that have not yet earned the title of Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC). A dog must achieve 3 clear Advanced Standard rounds under 2 different judges to be awarded the AADC title.

3. AAC Masters Class:

The Master Class shall be for dogs having earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC) title. To be awarded the Master Agility Dog of Canada (MADC) title by the AAC, a dog must achieve 3 clear Master Standard rounds under 2 different judges.

4. **Steeplechase:** is a class offered at one level, but open to all dogs. (Starters, Advanced and Masters compete together). It is a fast-moving course consisting of jumps, tire, tunnels, weave poles and an a-frame. 10 qualifying runs earn a Masters Steeplechase Dog of Canada title.

5. **Games:** Gamblers, Snooker and Jumpers are required at all levels for ATChC progression: Starters, Advanced and Masters. Progression from one level to the next is as follows: Movement into Advanced Games from Starters level games requires two qualifying scores, under 2 different judges, in the Starters game to move to that Advanced Game. The Starters Games Dog of Canada title requires 2 Q's in each of the 3 games at the Starters level. Movement into Masters games from Advanced level games requires three qualifying scores, under 2 different judges in the Advanced Game to move to that Masters game and Masters requires four qualifying scores (under 2 different judges) in each of the 3 games.

Bitches in Season (BIS) are welcome to compete but must follow the following AAC guidelines:

Requirements for BIS at AAC Trials:

At any AAC event where BIS are allowed to compete, the following conditions will apply and must be clearly stated in the club premium:

1. Handlers are required to notify the trial secretary that they will be running a BIS at the event as soon as it is known.
2. It must be stated in the club premium that handlers should minimize exposure of their BIS to other dogs and limit their movements about the grounds. Please park away from the entry to the arena.
3. Competitors will be notified there is a BIS on site.
4. A protective mat shall be used at the start line. The mat must be provided by the competitor.
5. BIS will be required to run in protective panties.
6. BIS will run as a group at the end of each class.

7. "BIS" will be noted next to the dog's name on the gate sheet so that other competitors, ring crew and the Judge(s) are aware.
8. BIS must use a designated relief area.
9. BIS must wear protective panties when not running or not within the designated relief area.

Regardless of whether BIS are allowed at a particular trial, or not, competitors with dogs that come into season will be allowed to withdraw and will be offered a refund or (optional) credit if they choose not to compete.

Please Note:

Like a lot of dog sport venues, we are in a rural area where hunting practice may occur, so please bear the possibility of noise during our event.

There will be no food vendor on site so please pack a lunch. The town of Collingwood is 15 minutes away should you wish to travel for food supplies.

Drive slowly on the property at all times!

Park only in the designated parking area and follow the guidance of our "parking valet".

There will be no equipment familiarization on the day of the trial.

There will be a warm-up area with a single jump provided for dogs that are about to run.

All dogs must remain on leash when not in the agility arena or when using the warm up jump provided.

All dogs competing at this event are at different stages in their training journey – please help us contribute to a safe and respectful competition space. Please keep your dog(s) under control and respect the space of other dogs and handlers. Even if your dog is friendly, many dogs competing may not want the interaction.

Acceptable hardware for your dogs:

The use of Flexis or retractable leashes is not permitted on the property. Pinch, prong or electronic collars are not permitted to be used at AAC sanctioned events.

No Smoking please. The entire property is smoke free.

Poop and scoop:

You must clean up after your dog and yourselves at all times and in any area. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from the site or refusal of future entries.

Crating:

There is space indoors for crating your dogs within the arena building.

There is a designated horse stall for general crating as well as “reserved crating” for a small fee. Please contact the Trial Secretary to request to book into a reserved crating space. You can also crate from your car. There is parking available in front of and to the rear of the arena building.

It is imperative that noise from barking dogs be kept to a minimum both within the facility or if crating from your vehicle or when exercising your dogs. This facility is in a beautiful rural area and sound can travel easily. We would like to maintain respect for our country neighbours so that we can host many more agility trials in this location.

Off Leash Fenced Field ~ Please note that this is not an off leash dog park.

There is a fully fenced off leash area for dogs to exercise in. Handlers and their dogs may use this space under the following guidelines:

- All dog waste must be removed promptly and deposited in the waste receptacle provided.
- Please do not enter the area without first checking to see if there are others in the space who may not want to have their dog(s) interact with yours.
- Limit of two handlers and their dogs in this space at any one time.
 - The space may be used by one dog to accommodate the dog and handlers needs. Please communicate if your dog is to be solo in the off-leash area.
 - If a Handler has more than one dog and needs to use the area for their quick warm – please communicate this.
- Please be mindful that this space is for use by all and is intended as a brief off leash warm up for your dogs and no dogs should be left unattended or tethered.

The area can and will be closed if event staff do not see it being used in a safe and respectful way.

By limiting your time within the **Off Leash Fenced Field** we can be sure that everyone can have access as needed.

Please respect the out of bounds areas.

I certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. This entry is submitted for acceptance on the foregoing representation and General Agreement/Disclaimer. I agree to conduct myself (ourselves) in accordance with such Official Rules and Regulations (including all provisions applying to discipline) and to abide by any decisions made with them.

I agree that the organization hosting this event (All About Dogs Inc.) has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the organization shall deem to be sufficient.
